

Using the sticky notes, write down the rhythmical and comment tools to mark and name them in the text.

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

Tasks

- What do you think happens to Crane at the end?
- Why is Crane so eager to rent a room without advertising?
- Study the worksheet "Short Story". What characteristic of a short story can you find in "The Room"? Use the comment tool and point to the elements in the text.
- Study the worksheet "Plot". Analyse the plot of the story. Use the sticky notes and place the notes with the plot elements next to the page where they belong.
- Write down a list of the invented words/products in the story (use the sticky notes). Take the words apart and, with the help of linguee.de, analyse the use of language and try to imagine what the products are like.
- "Our society is heading in the direction described in "The Room". Discuss this statement!



The "Porch Scene"

1. Read p. 62, l. 14 – p. 67, l. 10.
2. Take notes on the following aspects:
 1. What do we learn about Carl' and Cecil Walker's characters?
 2. What might be the reasons for Larry to behave the way he does in these scenes?
 3. What do we learn about Silas through the way he reacts to Larry telling the old story about Cecil and the fireworks (p. 65, l. 5ff)?
 4. How does this contrast with how he behaves later in his life?

Carl's character (task 1)

- alcoholic and smokes	Tells a lot of funny stories about Cecil at work and has a superior role in their friendship
- violent	
- has fun threatening others	
- gloating	
Has very racist tendencies and clearly sees black people with different eyes	encourages Cecil's behaviour
- thrived and influenced by Cecil's behaviour	thinks Larry can't provide for himself
wants to feel powerful	thinks Larry is weak
Larry is constantly ridiculed by him	He is a very patriarchal figure (-> Larry and his mom are very careful how they behave around him)
passive behaviour towards Cecil's actions	
He has no empathy/ he is cold-hearted -> When Cecil shoots a rocket at Cindy, Carl just watches Cecil doing it. He rather motivates him of shooting another rocket at her than protecting Cindy -> He laughs about Cecil when his coat burns, instead of helping him, although Cecil's life is in danger	

Cecil's character (task 1)

- He is kind of reckless, shoots with fireworks at his step daughter	behaves in a silly manner, mean to Cindy
- has fun threatening others	
- very gloating	
Is always the "fool" that gets laughed at for his humiliating actions and behaviour	Treats his step-daughter [Stiefschwester] Cindy in an inappropriate manner
- doesn't really think about his behaviour and the results what shows	- special humor just like Carl which also can lead to a lack of respect
- confident in the way he acts because he stands by his actions	- drinks and smokes a lot - gruff/rough
acts inappropriately especially towards Cindy	he thinks he can allow himself everything, which leads to disgusting behaviour
Abusive of Cindy	He drinks and smokes on a daily basis
Cecil is thoughtless/ careless	Cecil has no control over himself when he is drunk

Larry's motives for behaving the way he does (task 2)

- wants to adapt to his father's behavior	Wants to see his father at Cecil's house. He wants to leave
- maybe he's even scared	- Doesn't want Silas to see the behaviour of his father
- wants to fit into his father's humor -> maybe then he will be proud of him	- Is scared that they might get caught and Carl will notice he stole a gun from him
Feels no right belonging to his father e.g. the way how both of them think differently, tries to create a belonging, is under pressure	When he sees his father at Cecil's house he wants to leave
His only friend is Silas and he is afraid of losing him and that is why he shares his life with Silas to spend more time and "to share more"	Wants to seem cool and is seeking for attention
He thinks when he copies Carl's behaviour, more people will like him (telling the story about Cecil)	Larry wants to show Silas the girl Cindy because she was his little secret
He drinks and smokes on a daily basis	- lack of selfconfidence (not enough courage to do the same thing as Silas)
Laughs at inappropriate and even dangerous things because his father does it too	

Insights about Silas, contrast to how he behaves later in life (tasks 3 + 4)

- not gloating at all -> doesn't understand why people can laugh at such things	- for him the situation sounded more mean than crazy
- stands up for Cindy -> very brave	
- kind of offends Larry because he didn't help	
-> later in his life Silas also doesn't stand up for Larry (doesn't help him)	
Was raised properly and knows what is wrong and right	
- although he stands up for Cindy, later he doesn't stand up for Larry -> there is a difference/ambivalent	
His reaction shows that he fears these types of people	
- But later in life as a sole law enforcement he is confronted with criminals on a daily basis	
His reaction is very sensitive, he cares about Cindy even if he hasn't even met her yet and doesn't think that this kind of stuff is funny	
This is maybe reflected in his choice to become a police officer, to protect people. Also Silas didn't laugh when Roy French and Angie were making jokes about the dead body he just found	
Silas is more objective/reflexive and looks at the facts	

TASK

"A child doesn't learn as much from what you say but from what you do."

1. What must it be like for Larry and Silas to grow up in an environment like we described, with men like Carl and Cecil around them? With mothers like Ina Ott or Alice Jones? Collect ideas below.

2. Which long-term consequences can we imagine from the experiences that the two boys make?

Use the "sticky notes" tool above to collect ideas in the green and blue boxes.

Larry's growing up and long-term consequences

Both the parents of Silas and Larry aren't happy with the fact that the two boys are hanging out with each other due to their different skin colors	For Larry seeing how Cecil and Carl behaves towards Cindy shows him, that it is ok to treat women that way
The environment Larry grows up in clearly affects his behaviour - Slowly develops violent and racist tendencies	He gets the impression, that Carl's behaviour is acceptable and his is not
	Due to his experiences in his childhood, he thinks that he is not worth for other people to spend time with him

He stays insecure the rest of his life because his father made him feel inferior

On the other hand, his mother shows Larry love and affection, that's why he is so nice as an adult

Silas' growing up and long-term consequences

The environment Silas grows up in clearly affects his behaviour - Due to his childhood with not a lot of money he learned to be happy with the little things he has	Silas probably has a good role model in his mother, who is a very hard worker
He never had a father figure in his life, he never learned things like mowing the lawn	He had to deal with racism all his life, it seems like he got used to it
